

# May Newsletter Olympic-West Sound

#### **MEETING NOTES:**

### AJ Mathison spoke about Cork Floors:

- Cork comes from the bark of oak trees grown in Portugal and North Africa.
- Compared to regular wood trees that are cut down and replanted, Cork bark is peeled off the tree (like peeling an orange) every 7 to 9 years and the tree lives for 200 + years. Cork renews itself; the tree thrives as its bark is peeled away.
- Unique look compared to other wood flooring. Many styles, tints and patterns to choose from.
   Cork tiles are used for commercial and plank used for residential.
- •Cork is wood and quiet under foot, absorbs sound. Cork is also warm and tends to hold heat. Can be used over a radiant heated floor (use a layer of 8 mil polyethylene as a moisture barrier between cork and subfloor).
- It's a resilient floor, like pulling the cork out of a wine bottle, it comes back to the original shape. Cork flooring will do the same, if you drop something on it, Cork tends to recover, unlike other woods. Very durable.
- Cork earns LEED points.
- Cork click planks can be installed on, below and above grade. When installing on cement or below grade, use a layer of 8 mil polyethylene between subfloor and new cork floor.

### Shawn Lumas spoke on Linoleum Floors:

- Invented 150 years ago and hasn't really changed, except now we have more color to choose from.
- Linoleum breaks down in landfills. No "off gas" is created.
- Doesn't shrink and it's antistatic equaling less maintenance. Dry buff like a wood product.
- Linoleum is now created like a newspaper on a printing press. Color is all the way through the depth of the product.
- Easy to repair if scratched. Keep an extra piece after installation, scrape off shavings into Elmer's white glue (will dry clear) and put in hole.
- Ambering, a natural phenomenon, can accrue if Linoleum doesn't get enough light. A yellow cast may be created, to correct just allow light to hit the spot. Natural sunlight will work quicker than light bulbs.
- Click planks and Marmoleum work well with radiant heat.
- Can be used in wet areas.
- 150 different colors and variety of designs for trim pieces.
- When being made, has a 3rd layer that is UV baked on and can last for 40 years.
- Linoleum is made out of Rosin, Wood flour, Cork flour, Linseed oil, Limestone, Jute and Pigments.

## Joe Gallegos spoke on Bamboo Floors:

- There is good and there is bad bamboo.
- Good bamboo is made from the Moso species, harvested around 5 years old and grown in China.
- On a bamboo stock, the bottom
  15 feet is junk because of moisture.
- After harvest, bamboo is boiled, kiln dried to a 5% to 9% moisture content rating and then laminated and processed into blanks which are then milled like traditional hard woods
- Check the ends of the boards for gaps or holes. Potential failure if the bamboo is not laminated with enough force.
- Check the milling for straightness/ tongue and groove of the flooring.
   Most manufacturers use low quality machinery to mill and have poor tongue and groove and straightness.
- Finish should have 100% aluminum oxide. Joe uses 7 layers.
- Use grade "A" materials only to avoid headaches and problems.
- To install, use glue or nails over radiant heat, concrete or above/below grade.
- Read warranty because many have large loop holes and make customers deal with original manufacturers in China.
- Comes in natural and carbonized colors, grains can be vertical or horizontal and available in pre-finished or unfinished.

Robert M. Baker Jr., CKD has been involved in the kitchen and bath industry throughout his career. As a building materials dealer he established the first kitchen showroom in his area in the 1950's, and opened the first independent kitchen dealership in the area in 1963.

Since selling his business in 1980 Baker has served the industry as association executive, custom shop sales manager, manufacturer's representative, marketing consultant, builder-distributor manager and senior designer, and currently as an independent designer.

As soon as his firm was eligible, Baker joined AIKD in 1965 and organized the Upstate New York Chapter in 1965, serving as chapter chairman 1965-1970. He was elected to the national Board of Directors in 1966, and served in all national offices from 1968 to 1980. Baker was actively involved in the growth of AIKD's membership and programs. As Membership Chairman and President, he personally reviewed every membership application for over four years.

He achieved CKD Certification in 1969 and as NKBA's Director of Administration from 1980 to 1985, Baker brought stability and structure to a staff that was experiencing over 100% annual turnover. He was actively involved in the development of National Kitchen & Bath Month, the computerization of the office, and in the growth of the CKD Program as CKD Administrator. As an active participant in the National Board of Directors as Past President from 1986 to 1990, Baker was a member of the Hall of Fame committee from 1991 to 2001, and served as chairman from 1992 to 2001.

He organized the New Mexico Sub-Chapter in 2002 and served on the NKBA Standards Committee from 2003 to 2005.

Baker spearheaded the organization of the Olympic-West Sound Sub-Chapter in 2006, and currently serves as Chapter Representative.
